*Confession of Faith

Westminster Shorter Catechism

- Q.1. What is the chief end of man?
- A. Man's chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy him forever.
- Q. 2. What rule hath God given to direct us how we may glorify and enjoy him?
- A. The Word of God, which is contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, is the only rule to direct us how we may glorify and enjoy him.
- Q. 3. What do the Scriptures principally teach?
- A. The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God, and what duty God requires of man.

The Westminster Shorter Catechism expresses the truths of the Bible in summary form. It was comprised at the Westminster Assembly in London (1643-1648), and it sets forth the doctrinal standards of our church and our denomination, the Presbyterian Church in America.

If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word has no place in our lives.
