Westminster Shorter Catechism 84-88

- Q. 84. What does every sin deserve?
- A. Every sin deserves God's wrath and curse, both in this life, and that which is to come.
- Q. 85. What does God require of us, that we may escape his wrath and curse, due to us for sin?
- A. To escape the wrath and curse of God, due to us for sin, God requires of us faith in Jesus Christ, repentance unto life, with the diligent use of all the outward means whereby Christ communicates to us the benefits of redemption.
- Q 86. What is faith in Jesus Christ?
- A. Faith in Jesus Christ is a saving grace, whereby we receive and rest upon him alone for salvation, as he is offered to us in the gospel.
- Q. 87. What is repentance unto life?
- A. Repentance unto life is a saving grace, whereby a sinner, out of a true sense of his sin, and apprehension of the mercy of God in Christ, does, with grief and hatred of his sin, turn from it unto God, with full purpose of and endeavor after, new obedience.
- Q. 88. What are the outward and ordinary means whereby Christ communicates to us the benefits of redemption.
- A. The outward and ordinary means whereby Christ communicates to us the benefits of redemption are, his ordinances, especially the Word, sacraments, and prayer; all which are made effectual to the elect for salvation.

The Westminster Shorter Catechism expresses the truths of the Bible in summary form. It was comprised at the Westminster Assembly in London (1643-1648), and it sets forth the doctrinal standards of our church and our denomination, the Presbyterian Church in America.

Let us love and sing and wonder, Let us praise the Savior's name! He has hushed the Law's loud thunder, He has quenched Mount Sinai's flame: He has washed us with His blood; He has washed us with His blood; He has brought us nigh to God.
