Children's Catechism 1-13

1. Q. *Who made you?*

7. Q. *In how many Persons does this one God exist?*
A. In three Persons.
8. Q. *Name these three persons.*
A. The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
9. Q. *What is God?*
A. God is a Spirit and does not have a body like men.
10. Q. *Where is God?*
A. God is everywhere.
11. Q. *Can you see God?*
A. No. I cannot see God, but he always sees me.
12. Q. *Does God know all things?*
A. Yes. Nothing can be hidden from God.
13. Q. *Can God do all things?*
A. Yes. God can do all his holy will.

Stewardship Principles

Sermon Series in August 2018

1. Psalm 24:1-2. God owns everything and has entrusted a portion to each of us. Therefore, we are stewards of God's resources, not owners, and we will give an account one day for our stewardship.
2. 1 Timothy 6:17 tells us that our God "...richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment." Let us enjoy what God provides and be thankful for his abundant provisions!
3. Matthew 6:19-24 & 1 Timothy 6:17-19. Jesus commands us not to store up treasures on earth...where we will either lose them or leave them behind. Instead, with a Kingdom mindset and an eye on eternity, we are to store up treasures in heaven by being "rich in good deeds...and willing to share."
4. 2 Corinthians 9:6-7. God loves a cheerful giver, one who gladly & generously gives his time, talents, money & possessions to help & serve & bless others.
5. 2 Corinthians 9:8-11. God will see to it that a cheerful giver always has an abundance so that he can continue to be a cheerful giver.
6. Proverbs 3:9-10 & Malachi 3:6-12. We honor God with our wealth when we gladly bring the whole tithe into the storehouse.
7. Matthew 6:25-34. Trust in your Heavenly Father and do not worry about your finances; seek first his Kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.
