Heidelberg Catechism #27 & 28

- Q. Christian, what do you understand by the providence of God?
- A. Providence is the almighty and ever present power of God, by which he upholds—as with his hand—
 heaven and earth and all creatures;
 and so rules them that leaf and blade, rain and drought,
 fruitful and lean years, food and drink, health and sickness,
 prosperity and poverty—all things, in fact,
 come to us not by chance, but from his fatherly hand.
- Q. How does the knowledge of God's creation and providence help us?
- A. We can be patient when things go against us, thankful when things go well, and for the future we can have good confidence in our faithful God and Father, that nothing will separate us from his love. All creatures are so completely in his hand, that without his will, they can neither move nor be moved.

The Heidelberg Catechism was composed in Heidelberg, Germany in 1563.

It has been translated into many European, Asian, and African languages, and is the most widely used and most warmly praised catechism of the Reformation period.

Call to Prayer Psalm 139:1-16

You have searched me, LORD, and you know me. You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar. You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways. Before a word is on my tongue you, LORD, know it completely. You hem me in behind and before, and you lay your hand upon me. Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain.

Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there. If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea, even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast.

If I say, Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me,: even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you. For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was make in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth. Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be.
