

Guiding Principles in Worship

North Macon Presbyterian Church

A Reformed approach to worship

- To glorify God is our primary objective in worship.
- To allow Scripture alone to prescribe what we do (and what we do not do) in worship.
- To develop worship services that are Christ-centered and Gospel-shaped. Also, to ensure that the elements of the service are thematically and coherently connected.
- To ensure that the reading and preaching of God's Word are prominent in the worship service.

Musical parameters in our worship service

- To sing songs that are biblically sound and theologically rich so that we might best meditate upon the excellencies of our God and His salvation in Jesus Christ. Also, to select songs that have musical depth and integrity.
- To emphasize congregational singing, thereby encouraging the participation of all. We do not want our people to become spectators or to feel that they are attending a performance. Consequently, we want to select songs that are suitable for congregational singing.
- To have diversity and charity in our musical style and instrumentation. We want the maximum number of people in our diverse congregation to be able to worship God in spirit and in truth on any given Sunday. Further, we want to encourage each member to heartily embrace the diversity of musical styles as a demonstration of neighborly love for one another and of unity in the body of Christ.
- To be led in worship by our own members, who lead a holy life amongst us and are Spirit-filled. We do not want performers or outside professionals to lead us in worship (as a general principle).
- We want our singing (and everything else in worship) to be done "decently and in order", with reverence, and with excellence. God deserves and demands our best.

- 1. **TREY AND KIKKI ADAMS** are in the states on HMA (Home Missionary Assignment) and are staying at the Ream's mission house. They serve the Lord in **Thailand**.
- 2. **Brian and Mandy** are part of a team planting a church in a city of 10 million people in **South Asia.** They are also involved in training a network of national church-planters.
- 3. KAY BURKLIN is MTW's (Mission to the World) European liaison with refugees.

- 8. **Dr. Victor and Nosizo Nakah** are serving in **Africa** where Dr. Nakah is the international director of missions for the whole continent of Africa.
- 9. JIM AND MARY ALICE PATTERSON have been working with Wycliffe Bible Translators in Australia and Malaysia on a project which helps produce and edit God's Word in audio format for people groups who can then hear the Scriptures in their own language.
- 10. **DAVID AND ERIN PERVIS** are in a church planting ministry **Greece**, reaching people with the gospel through several means, one being teaching English.
- 11. **JOHN AND DYLAN PETERS**, who are former members of NMPC, are working in **Costa Rica** alongside of the Davilas. They are using their gifts to reach and equip youth and college students through discipleship and mentoring.
- 12. MIKE AND ELI SABIN help spread the gospel throughout Southeast Asia by means of Trans World Radio on Guam. Christian programming is broadcast to places that otherwise would have no Christian witness.
- 13. ROGER AND DIANNE SMALLING write, publish, distribute, and teach reformed literature in Latin America.
- 14. **DAL AND BETH STANTON** lead a church planting team in Sofia, **Bulgaria**. They have developed a special outreach, the "Daughters of Bulgaria" a ministry to prostitutes and women who have been victims of trafficking.
- 15. **Josh Tsavatewa** is a missionary sent out from NMPC who works among the **Yakama Tribe** in **Washington State** as the Children's Ministry Director with Sacred Road Ministries.
- 16. **Bruce and Barbara Wannemacher** provide spiritual care, training and leadership for all MTW missionaries who are serving in **Sub-Sahara Africa**.
