*Confession of Faith

Westminster Confession of Faith, Chapter 20.1

Pastor: Christian, what do you believe about the liberty Christ has purchased for you?

People: The liberty which Christ has purchased for believers under the gospel consists in our freedom from

the guilt of sin, the condemning wrath of God, and the curse of the moral law;

and in our being delivered from this present evil world, bondage to Satan, dominion of sin, the evil of afflictions, the sting of death, the victory of the grave, and everlasting damnation;

and also in our free access to God, and our yielding obedience unto him, not out of slavish fear, but a child-like love, and willing mind.

All which were common also to believers under the law;
but under the New Testament,
the liberty of Christians is further enlarged
in our freedom from the yoke of slavery to the ceremonial law,
to which the Jewish Church was subjected,
and in greater boldness of access to the throne of grace,
and in fuller communications with the Spirit of God,
than believers under the law did ordinarily partake.

The Westminster Confession of Faith expresses the teachings of the Bible in summary form. It was comprised at the Westminster Assembly in London (1643-1648), and it sets forth the doctrinal standards of our church and our denomination, the Presbyterian Church in America.

Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your body.

We tend to pride ourselves on "having it all together" and giving the appearance that we do not need anyone or anything.

We desperately need a place where we can take off our masks, admit our sin and failures, and be received and accepted. We long for a genuine community where we can be loved as we really are, and, in turn, love others as they really are. NMPC is committed to be that place—a home—where folks are welcomed, embraced, and loved.

Proclaiming the Gospel

NMPC's primary task is to "Proclaim the Gospel", for the Gospel is the power of God for salvation. To spell it out more particularly, we are committed to preach the good news of Jesus Christ, in the whole counsel of Scripture, by the power of the Holy Spirit, with Reformed theological convictions, in a caring and gracious community, so that we might present everyone perfect in Christ. Therefore, in every worship service, every Sunday school class, every small group, and every ministry of the church, we are committed to proclaim the Gospel as of chief importance for the transformation of lives.

Partnering with Ministries

NMPC is also committed to carrying the good news of the Gospel—in word and deed—into our community and around the world. We seek to do so through strategic partnerships with *ministries* in our community and *missionaries* around the globe. We are committed to **pray** for, **partner** with, and **participate** in these ministries so that we might make disciples of Jesus Christ of all nations.

Missionaries Supported by NMPC

- 1. TREY AND KIKKI ADAMS are in the states now and plan to return to Thailand later this year.
- MARGARET BAKER, one of our own members, is providing administrative support to two of our missionaries, the Davilas and the Peters, in Costa Rica
- 3. **Brian and Mandy** are part of a team which is planting a city-center church in a city of 10 million people in **South Asia**. They are also involved in training a network of national church-planters.
- 4. KAY BURKLIN is MTW's (Mission to the World) European liaison with refugees.
- RODNEY AND JANA DAVILA minister in Costa Rica, planting churches and teaching and training pastors.
- 6. **Jonas and Christina Davison** are part of a church planting team in **Japan** where they use the arts to build bridges for evangelism & discipleship.
- 7. **JEFF AND JAMIE** are church planters in **India**, and Jeff teaches rural pastors in a seminary.
- 8. RICH AND CHRISSY GREETE have a counseling ministry to Mission to the World missionaries here in the States and on mission fields in other parts of the world.
- Dr. Victor and Nosizo Nakah are serving in Africa where Dr. Nakah is the international director of missions for Sub-Sahara Africa.
- 10. JIM AND MARY ALICE PATTERSON have been working with Wycliffe Bible Translators in Australia and Malaysia on Vernacular Media Services, a project which helps produce and edit God's Word in audio format for people groups who can then hear the Scriptures in their own language.
- 11. **DAVID AND ERIN PERVIS** are in a church planting ministry **Greece**, reaching people with the gospel through several means, one being teaching English.
- 12. **JOHN AND DYLAN PETERS**, who are former members of NMPC, work in **Costa Rica** alongside of the Davilas. They minister to youth and college students through discipleship and mentoring.
- 13. Mike and Eli Sabin help spread the gospel throughout Southeast Asia by means of Trans World Radio on Guam. Christian programming is broadcast to places that otherwise would have no Christian witness.
- 14. ROGER AND DIANNE SMALLING write, distribute, and teach reformed literature in Latin America.
- 15. **DAL AND BETH STANTON** lead a church planting team in Sofia, **Bulgaria**. They have developed a special outreach, the "Daughters of Bulgaria", a ministry to women who have been victims of trafficking.
- 16. NOAH AND KARLEIGH STEPHENS are church planters in Bangkok, Thailand.
- 17. **JOSH TSAVATEWA** is a missionary sent out from NMPC who works among the **Yakama Tribe** in **Washington State** as a Teaching Elder with Sacred Road Ministries.
- Bruce and Barbara Wannemacher provide spiritual care, training and leadership for all MTW
 missionaries who are serving in Sub-Sahara Africa.
- 19. **STEPHEN AND SARAH YOUNG** worked in Perth, Australia with the Japanese people. They are now located in Tennessee where Stephen continues his work with the Japanese and Sarah, an acclaimed author of best -selling devotional books (*Jesus Calling*), continues her writing ministry.
 - **CAROLINE FLEMING, one of NMPC's own missionaries, has worked in Bible translation and literacy. She continues such work through Wycliffe Associates and is self-funded.
