from now on to live for him.

The Heidelberg Catechism was composed in Heidelberg, Germany in 1563. It has been translated into many European, Asian, and African languages, and is the most widely used and most warmly praised catechism of the Reformation period.

The angel of the LORD found Hagar near a spring in the desert; it was the spring that is beside the road to Shur. And he said, "Hagar, slave of Sarai, where have you come from, and where are you going?" "I'm running away from my mistress Sarai," she answered. Then the angel of the LORD told her, "Go back to your mistress and submit to her." The angel added, "I will increase your descendants so much that they will be too numerous to count."

The angel of the LORD also said to her: You are now pregnant and you will give birth to a son. You shall name him Ishmael, for the LORD has heard of your misery. He will be a wild donkey of a man; his hand will be against everyone and everyone's hand against him, and he will live in hostility toward all his brothers.

She gave this name to the LORD who spoke to her: "You are the God who sees me," for she said, "I have now seen the One who sees me." That is why the well was called Beer Lahai Roi; it is still there, between Kadesh and Bered.

So Hagar bore Abram a son, and Abram gave the name Ishmael to the son she had borne. Abram was eighty-six years old when Hagar bore him Ishmael.

- 1. TREY AND KIKKI ADAMS are in the states now and plan to return to Thailand later this year.
- 2. MARGARET BAKER, one of our own members, is providing administrative support to two of our missionaries, the Davilas and the Peters, in Costa Rica.
- 3. **Brian and Mandy** are part of a team which is planting a city-center church in a city of 10 million people in **South Asia**. They are also involved in training a network of national church-planters.
- 4. KAY BURKLIN is MTW's (Mission to the World) European liaison with refugees.
- 5. RODNEY AND JANA DAVILA minister in Costa Rica, planting churches and teaching and training pastors.
- 6. **Jonas and Christina Davison** are part of a church planting team in **Japan** where they use the arts to build bridges for evangelism & discipleship.
- 7. **JEFF AND JAMIE** are church planters in India, and Jeff teaches rural pastors in a seminary.
- 8. RICH AND CHRISSY GREETE have a counseling ministry to Mission to the World missionaries here in the States and on mission fields in other parts of the world.
- 9. Dr. Victor and Nosizo Nakah are serving in Africa where Dr. Nakah is the international director of missions for Sub-Sahara Africa.
- 10. JIM AND MARY ALICE PATTERSON have been working with Wycliffe Bible Translators in Australia and Malaysia on Vernacular Media Services, a project which helps produce and edit God's Word in audio format for people groups who can then hear the Scriptures in their own language.
- 11. **DAVID AND ERIN PERVIS** are in a church planting ministry **Greece**, reaching people with the gospel through several means, one being teaching English.
- 12. MIKE AND ELI SABIN help spread the gospel throughout Southeast Asia by means of Trans World Radio on Guam. Christian programming is broadcast to places that otherwise would have no Christian witness.
- 13. ROGER AND DIANNE SMALLING write, distribute, and teach reformed literature in Latin America.
- 14. **DAL AND BETH STANTON** lead a church planting team in Sofia, **Bulgaria**. They have developed a special outreach, the "Daughters of Bulgaria", a ministry to women who have been victims of trafficking.
- 15. NOAH AND KARLEIGH STEPHENS are church planters in Bangkok, Thailand.
- 16. **Josh Tsavatewa** is a missionary sent out from NMPC who works among the **Yakama Tribe** in **Washington State** as a Teaching Elder with Sacred Road Ministries.
- 17. BRUCE AND BARBARA WANNEMACHER provide spiritual care, training and leadership for all MTW missionaries who are serving in Sub-Sahara Africa.
- 18. **Stephen and Sarah Young** worked in Perth, **Australia with the Japanese people.** They are now located in Tennessee where Stephen continues his work with the Japanese and Sarah, an acclaimed author of best -selling devotional books (*Jesus Calling*), continues her writing ministry.
 - **JOHN AND DYLAN PETERS**, who are former members of NMPC, have been working in Costa Rica alongside of the Davilas. They have completed a 3 year commitment and have returned to the states.
 - **Caroline Fleming, one of NMPC's own missionaries, has worked in Bible translation and literacy. She continues such work through Wycliffe Associates and is self-funded.
