Pastor: What does the fourth commandment require?

People: The fourth commandment requires us to set apart to God the times He has established in His Word—specifically one whole day out of every seven as a holy Sabbath to Him.

Pastor: Which day of the week has God designated as the Sabbath?

People: From the beginning of the world until the resurrection of Christ, God established the seventh day of the week as the Sabbath.

From that time until the end of the world, the first day of the week is the Christian Sabbath.

Pastor: How do we keep the Sabbath holy?

People: We keep the Sabbath holy by resting the whole day from worldly affairs or recreations, even ones that are lawful on other days.

Except for necessary works or acts of mercy, we should spend all our time publicly and privately worshipping God.

Pastor: What does the fourth commandment forbid?

People: The fourth commandment forbids failing to do or carclessly doing what we are supposed to do. It also forbids treating the day as unholy by loafing, by doing anything in itself sinful, or by unnecessary thinking, talking about, or working on our worldly affairs or recreations.

The Westminster Shorter Catechism expresses the teachings of the Bible in summary form. It was comprised at the Westminster Assembly in London (1643-1648), and it sets forth the doctrinal standards of our church and our denomination, the Presbyterian Church in America.

Scripture Reading Mark 2:23-3:6

One Sabbath Jesus was going through the grainfields, and as his disciples walked along, they began to pick some heads of grain. The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is unlawful on the Sabbath?" He answered, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need? In the days of Abiathar the high priest, he entered the house of God and ate the consecrated bread, which is lawful only for priests to eat. And he also gave some to his companions." Then he said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath. So the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath."

Another time he went into the synagogue, and a man with a shriveled hand was there. Some of them were looking for a reason to accuse Jesus, so they watched him closely to see if he would heal him on the Sabbath. Jesus said to the man with the shriveled hand, "Stand up in front of everyone." Then Jesus asked them, "Which is lawful on the Sabbath: to do good or to do evil, to save life or to kill?" But they remained silent. He looked around at them in anger and, deeply distressed at their stubborn hearts, said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was completely restored. Then the Pharisees went out and began to plot with the Herodians how they might kill Jesus.
