bondage to Satan, dominion of sin, the evil of afflictions, the sting of death, the victory of the grave, and everlasting damnation;


and also in our free access to God, and our yielding obedience unto him, not out of slavish fear, but a child-like love, and willing mind.

and in greater boldness of access to the throne of grace,
and in fuller communications with the Spirit of God,
than believers under the law did ordinarily partake.

Pray also for me, that whenever I speak, words may be given me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel, for which I am an ambassador in chains. Pray that I may declare it fearlessly, as I should.


