*Confession of Faith

Westminster Confession of Faith, Chapter 20.1

Pastor: Christian, what do you believe about the liberty Christ has purchased for you?

People: The liberty which Christ has purchased for us under the gospel consists in our freedom from the guilt of sin, the condemning wrath of God, and the curse of the moral law; and in our being delivered from this present evil world, bondage to Satan, dominion of sin. the evil of afflictions, the sting of death, the victory of the grave, and everlasting damnation; and also in our free access to God, and our yielding obedience unto him, not out of slavish fear, but a child-like love, and willing mind.

All which were common also to believers under the law;
but under the New Testament,
the liberty of Christians is further enlarged
in our freedom from the yoke of slavery to the ceremonial law,
to which the Jewish Church was subjected,
and in greater boldness of access to the throne of grace,
and in fuller communications with the Spirit of God,
than believers under the law did ordinarily partake.

The Westminster Confession of Faith expresses the teachings of the Bible in summary form. It was comprised at the Westminster Assembly in London (1643-1648), and it sets forth the doctrinal standards of our church and our denomination, the Presbyterian Church in America.
