That's not fair! I'm going to take a guess that you've said those words before - I know I have. Maybe your sister got a bigger scoop of ice cream. Maybe you practiced your sport all summer but the kid who chose to play video games made the team instead of you. Maybe your brother made a mess with the Legos and your parents made both of you clean them up. (That last one is a real life example from the Cathey house!)

Oftentimes when we are tempted to yell out "That's not fair!" we are upset that someone got something we feel they didn't deserve. But do we want God to treat us as we deserve?

We know that every one of us is a sinner, and because of our sin, we are separated from God. But God doesn't stop there! Romans 3:23 - 24 says "For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard. Yet God, with **undeserved kindness**, declares that we are righteous. He did this through Christ Jesus when He freed us from the penalty of our sins." And Romans 6:23 says, "For the wages of sin is death, but the **free gift** of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord." We did absolutely nothing to deserve God's goodness and kindness. In fact, we deserved to be forever separated from Him. But because God is so loving, generous and kind, He gave us the gift of Jesus so that we can be friends with Him and serve Him both in this life and for all eternity. How thankful I am that God didn't treat me like I deserve!

Are there times when things don't seem fair and it hurts? You bet. We live in a fallen world and so things aren't how they should be. Family members get sick. Friends hurt our feelings. Bad things happen in our lives, and it doesn't seem fair. But when you begin to feel that way, remember that God loves you and is in control of all things. Our God is so powerful and amazing that He promises that He will use everything – good and bad – that happens to us for His glory and our good.

As Romans 8:28 says, "We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him. He appointed them to be saved in keeping with His purpose." When we are saved by God, there is absolutely nothing that can take us away from His love and promises.

So next time you're tempted to complain, and you feel yourself about to say, "That's not fair!" think about the amazing, undeserved love of your Heavenly Father and how He is working everything for His glory and your good.
