Apostles' Creed

Revelation 17-22: A Tale of Two Cities

Babylon the Harlot (17:1-19:10) & Jerusalem the Bride (21:9-22:9) and the Transition between the Two Cities (19:11-21:8)

After the destruction of Babylon the Harlot:

...and out of the temple came a loud voice from the throne, saying, "It is done!" (16:17).

Beginning of the section (17:1-19:10)

One of the 7 angels who had the 7 bowls came and said to me, "Come, I will show you the punishment of the great prostitute, who sits on many waters. With her the kings of the earth committed adultery and the inhabitants of the earth were intoxicated with her wine..."

Then the angel carried me away in the Spirit into a desert. There I saw a woman sitting on a scarlet beast that was covered with blasphemous names and had 7 heads and 10 horns (17:1-3).

Ending of the section (17:1-19:10)

And he added, "These are the true words of God." At this I fell at his feet to worship him. But he said to me, "Do not do it. I am a fellow servant with you and with your brothers who hold to the testimony of Jesus. Worship God! For the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy" (19:9b-10).

After the revelation of Jerusalem the Bride:

He said to me, "It is done!" I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End (21:6).

Beginning of the section (21:9-22:9)

One of the 7 angels who had the 7 bowls full of the 7 last plagues came and said to me, "Come I will show you the bride, the wife of the Lamb."

And he carried me away in the Spirit to a mountain great and high, and showed me the Holy City, Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God. It shone with the glory of God, and its brilliance was like of a very precious jewel, like a jasper, clear as crystal (21:9-11).

Ending of the section (21:9-22:9)

The angel said to me, "These words are trustworthy and true. The Lord, the God of the spirits of the prophets, sent his angel to show his servants...

I, John, am the one who heard and saw these things. And when I had heard and seen them, I fell down to worship at the feet of the angel who had been showing them to me. But he said to me, "Do not do it! I am a fellow servant with you and with your brothers the prophets and of all who keep the words of this book. Worship God!" (22:6-9).

Comparing & Contrasting the Harlot & the Bride

- One is clothed with bright & pure linen and adorned with costly jewels, which reflects
 the glory of God and the righteous deeds of the saints; the other is clothed in purple &
 scarlet and glittering with gold, precious stones & pearls, which hides her corruption
- One is a pure bride, the 'wife of the Lamb', the true church; the other an impure harlot, 'the Mother of Prostitutes', a counterfeit church
- One faithfully witnesses to the eternal kingdom of God and offers the water of life to
 the world; the other seduces the world to idolatry, is drunk with the blood of the
 saints, and by her wine brings death to the world
- One has her security in heaven; the other in her power over the multitudes of the earth
- The bride is the heart of the new creation; the harlot ends in eternal destruction

Therefore, Revelation 17-22 is a fuller treatment of the destruction of God's enemies—in reverse order of which they were introduced—and the ushering in of the New Jerusalem in the New Heavens and New Earth. These chapters are a large interpretive review of the 6th & 7th bowls of God's wrath, which foretold the judgment of Babylon. It is best to view the visions of Revelation 17-22 as varying camera angles on the same, final judgment in which God and His Christ will triumph and bring the consummation of the Kingdom of God (rather than distinct events occurring in strict, chronological succession).
