Heidelberg Catechism, Q. 45 & 49

- Q. Christian, how does Christ's resurrection benefit us?
- A. First, by his resurrection he has overcome death, so that he might make us share in the rightcousness he won for us by his death.

  Second, by his power we too are already now resurrected to a new life.

  Third, Christ's resurrection is a guarantee of our glorious resurrection.
- Q How does Christ's ascension to heaven benefit us?
- A. First, he pleads our cause in heaven
  in the presence of the Father.

  Second, we have our own flesh in heaven—
  a guarantee that Christ our head
  will take us, his members, to himself in heaven.

  Third, he sends his Spirit to us on earth as a further guarantee.
  By the Spirit's power
  we make the goal of our lives,
  not earthly things, but the things above
  where Christ is sitting at God's right hand. Amen.

The Heidelberg Catechism was composed in Heidelberg, Germany in 1563.

It has been translated into many European, Asian, and African languages and is the most widely used and most warmly praised catechism of the Reformation period.
