He also watches over me in such a way
that not a hair can fall from my head

Because I belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him. Amen.

The Heidelberg Catechism was composed in Heidelberg, Germany in 1563.

It has been translated into many European, Asian, and African languages and is the most widely used and most warmly praised catechism of the Reformation period.



The Preached Word

Title: Perspectives on the Cross Text: Philippians 2:8

Pastor: Rev. Hunter Stevenson

Lord Jesus, I want to become your follower. I come to You acknowledging I am a sinner justly deserving eternal condemnation. I realize there is nothing I can do to make myself acceptable to you through my own efforts. I believe you are God the Son who became a man, lived a perfect life, and then allowed Yourself to be crucified.
